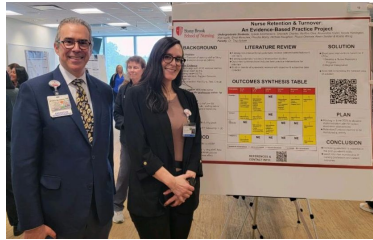

Quit & Thrive Challenge: Community–Derived Solutions to Reduce Menthol Cigarette Smoking

Description: Office of Disease Prevention and the U.S. Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC) are sponsoring the Quit & Thrive Challenge: Community–Derived Solutions to Reduce Menthol Cigarette Smoking to enhance the evidence base of interventions to help individuals from populations experiencing health disparities quit smoking, with a specific emphasis on menthol cigarettes. This Challenge encourages submissions from local and state organizations and agencies to highlight promising community–led solutions to address menthol cigarette smoking.

Up to nine prizes of \$100,000 each will be awarded to organizations with the most successful or innovative community–led strategies.

Winter 2025 OVPR Revise and Resubmit Seed Grant Program

Description: The program will support the resubmission efforts of PIs/teams who have received highly favorable summary statements on prior, unfunded grant proposals submitted to external sponsors. The funds are to be utilized to explicitly address concerns and gaps in the original submissions as indicated by the reviewers. The OVPR Revise and Resubmit Seed Grant program will accept proposals from PIs targeting external funding opportunities from any sponsor for their resubmissions.

The average award size will be \$10,000. Well-justified proposals may request up to a maximum of \$15,000. This cycle is expected to award a total of \$30,000. Award periods will vary, but will be no longer than 12 months. PIs are expected to apply for external grants within the award period.
