PRE-LICENSURE ACADEMIC PROGRAMS

- **Accelerated Baccalaureate Program**
 - Requires a bachelor's degree in any field
 - Upon graduating, you will earn a Bachelor of Science degree with a major in nursing and become eligible to take the NCLEX – RN exam for licensure
- **Basic Baccalaureate Program**
 - Requires 57 credits of preadmission coursework
 - Upon graduating, you will earn a Bachelor of Science degree with a major in nursing and become eligible to take the NCLEX – RN exam for licensure
- Applying to both programs in the same semester is permissible if an applicant has a bachelor's degree

POST-LICENSURE ACADEMIC PROGRAMS

- **Registered Nurse to Baccalaureate**
 - Designed for students who passed the NCLEX and have either an associate's degree or diploma in nursing
 - Upon graduating, you will earn a Bachelor of Science degree with a major in nursing
- **Master's Degree and Advance Certificate**
- **Doctor of Nursing Practice (DNP)**
- **PhD in Nursing**

Accelerated Baccalaureate Program & Basic Baccalaureate Program

Accelerated Baccalaureate Program (ABP)

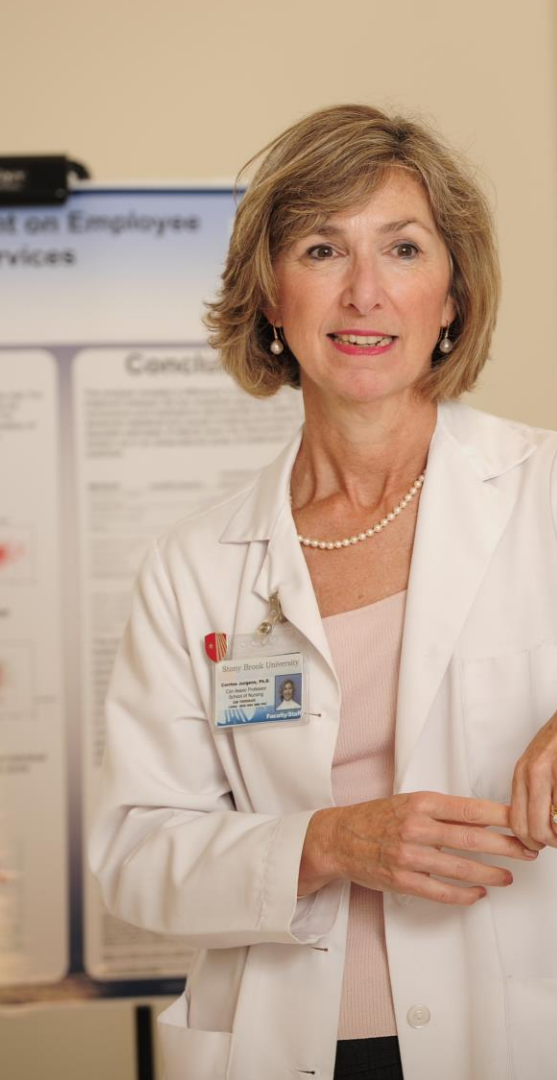
- 69 credits taken over twelve months (semesters: summer – early June, fall, spring)
- Summer term start, program begins once a year

• Basic Baccalaureate Program (BBP)

- 71 credits taken over two years or 4 academic semesters (semesters: fall, spring, fall, spring)
- 2 credits of elective are required for the BBP that are not required for the ABP
- Fall term start, program begins once a year

ABP and BBP:

- Bachelor of Science degree with a major in nursing
- After being admitted into the nursing program, students will be enrolling in only nursing classes.
- Full-time onsite programs with clinical assignments that include weekdays between 7 am and 9 pm and potentially weekends as well
- Clinicals conducted at Stony Brook University Hospital and other designated hospitals on Long Island
- You are responsible for transportation to and from the clinical site
- Outside work is discouraged for BBP students and prohibited for ABP students due to the time constraints and vigor of the programs
- Make sure that childcare and finances are in order before starting the program

Admissions Criteria

Accelerated Baccalaureate Program:

- B.A or B.S. Degree in any field
- Minimum cumulative GPA of 2.8 from all colleges/universities ever attended
- All required preadmission coursework completed with a C or higher
- C- and D grades are not acceptable/transferrable

Basic Baccalaureate Program:

- 57 credits of preadmission coursework
- Minimum cumulative GPA of 2.8 from all colleges/universities ever attended
- All required preadmission coursework completed with a C or higher
- C- and D grades are not acceptable/transferrable

Selection Process for ABP and BBP:

- Admission and Academic Standing Committee makes final decision regarding selections of incoming classes.



Accelerated and Basic Baccalaureate Program Admissions Requirements

- Official transcripts from all college/universities ever attended must be uploaded to the application.
- Completion of 3 of the 4 required preadmission sciences (Microbiology with lab, Chemistry, Anatomy and Physiology I with lab, and Anatomy and Physiology II with lab) with grades of C or higher. Grades must be posted on the transcript.
- Three (3) references must be submitted with your application
 - Vary your academic and professional recommendations. Family and friends are not acceptable references.
- Personal statement / essay
- Resume
- Interview and testing is required
- Completion of all prerequisite coursework is required prior to starting the program
- All outstanding prerequisite coursework must be posted on the official transcripts, and the official transcripts submitted and evaluated prior to the first day of classes.
- Service is beneficial although not required



Basic Baccalaureate Program Admissions Requirements with a Bachelor's degree

Applications to the Basic Baccalaureate Program WITH a previous bachelor's degree in a non-nursing major are required to complete only the following prerequisite course work:

- 3 credits English Composition
- 4 credits Microbiology with lab
- 4 credits of Anatomy and Physiology I with lab
- 4 credits of Anatomy and Physiology II with lab
- 3 credits of Chemistry
- 3 credits of Statistics
- 3 credits of Lifespan Development

ABP and BBP Prerequisite Coursework

Required prerequisite coursework (online or in person) may be taken at any appropriately accredited college/university

Many of our prerequisite courses are available on OPEN SUNY's website: explore.suny.edu

English Composition (3 credits):

- Introductory writing course offered by the English Department (Sometimes listed as Art and Craft of Writing)
- Must transfer in as an equivalent to Stony Brook University WRT 102 Intermediate Writing Workshop.
- Any other English writing course that does not transfer as WRT 102 will not satisfy the requirement
- This requirement is **not** satisfied by AP credits

Anatomy and Physiology I (4 credits) and Anatomy and Physiology II (4 credits)

OR

Anatomy (4 credits) and Physiology (4 credits):

- Anatomy and Physiology I and II are sequential courses
- 3 credits lecture/didactic
- 1 credit lab (2 credits total for both Anatomy and Physiology)
- 4 credits per course (8 credits total for both Anatomy and Physiology)

ABP and BBP Prerequisite Coursework

Chemistry (3 credits):

Must be a true chemistry and taught by a Chemistry Department

- General Chemistry
- Intro to Chemistry
- Organic Chemistry
- Foundations of Chemistry
- Principles of Chemistry
- Molecular Chemistry
- Biochemistry

Microbiology (4 credits):

- Offered by the Biology or Health Science Department
- 200 level or higher
- 3 credits lecture/didactic
- 1 credit lab
- 4 credits total

Statistics (3 credits):

- Statistics course can be under any department; examples include Business Statistics, Psychology Statistics, Biostatistics
- Research Methodology is acceptable if the course description includes statistics
- Calculus does not fulfill this requirement

Lifespan Development (3 credits)

- Taught out of the Psychology department
- Developmental Psychology and Human Development are also transferable
- Prefer Lifespan Development course

BBP Additional Prerequisite Coursework

Sociology (3 credits):

- Most sociology classes will fulfill the requirement
- Both introductory and upper-level classes are acceptable

Introduction to Psychology (3 credits):

- Must be an introductory class

Humanities (6 credits):

- Any literature, fine arts, philosophy, cultural, religion, foreign language, courses will fulfill the requirement
- History classes will not transfer for the humanities

United States History (3 credits):

- Any historical, political or cultural class with the course content limited to the United States will fulfill the requirement. Example: American Literature, United States Politics, United States History
- World History and Western Civilization are NOT acceptable

Fine Arts (3 credits):

- Any art, dance, music, drama and theatre course will fulfill the requirement
- Creative writing and poetry will transfer as well as applied history of an art form
- Yoga and Pilates are not acceptable

Global Issues (3 credits):

- Course content concentrates on a historical or cultural issue outside the United States and its interconnectedness to the world. Example: Western or Other World Civilizations, World History, Cultural Anthropology, World Religions
- Also accepted, study abroad programs conducted by a college/university

BBP Additional Prerequisite Coursework

Second Semester of a Foreign Language (3 credits)

- The second semester of a foreign language means having completed two college level semesters of a foreign language or the equivalent
- Colleges and university vary on course numbers.
- Example: French 101 and French 102 or French 100 and French 200
- Generally, a course level at 200 and above will transfer
- Taking a CLEP exam and receiving 6 credits or above will transfer
- Taking the New York State High School Regents exam will fulfill the foreign language requirement, but you must be a matriculated Stony Brook University student in order to register for the exam
- Meeting the "LANG" SBC requirement will fulfill the foreign language requirement
- American Sign Language will transfer

Electives (9 credits)

- Any class in which you received a letter grade of a "C" or higher that you have not used for another required prerequisite course
- May include Arts, Mathematics, Humanities, Social Sciences and Sciences

ABP and BBP Interview and Testing Process

Out of the pool of qualified applicants, between 150 and 200 students will be invited for a group interview and math and writing tests (this is part of the review process and is not an offer of admission)

- Group interviews will consist of a maximum of five applicants with two faculty members
- Math exam will include basic math in the areas of addition, subtraction, multiplications, division, decimals, percentages, fractions and algebra. No calculators are allowed. The math exam is completed via Zoom and proctored by faculty
- Writing exam is completed via Zoom and proctored by faculty
- Interview is approximately one hour, and testing is completed in one hour
