William T. Grant Scholars Program

We are writing to share an annual limited submission funding opportunity recently announced by the William T. Grant Foundation, which supports research aimed at improving the lives of young people in the United States. The William T. Grant Scholars Program supports career development for promising early-career researchers, and funds five-year research and mentoring plans that significantly expand researchers' expertise in new disciplines, methods, and content areas. The canvass has been posted on the OPD website.

How to Submit: If you are interested, you must submit the internal competitions form by Friday, March 8, 2024 and check off "Expressing interest in canvass" on the last question. The competition code for this program is LC202419.

Description: The Foundation supports research in two distinct focus areas: 1) Reducing inequality in youth outcomes, and 2) Improving the use of research evidence in policy and practice.

PI Eligibility: Applicants must have received their terminal degree within seven years of submitting their application. Applicants must be employed in career-ladder positions. For many applicants, this means holding a tenure-track position in a university.

Institutional Limit: 1 from each School/College

Award: \$350,000 over five years

Sponsor Deadline: Mentor and Reference Letter due June 12, 2024; Application

due July 3, 2024

2023-24 SUNY Research Seed Grant Program

SUNY has announced the RFP for the NIH Resubmission and NSF Revised Submission Support Awards under the 2023-24 SUNY Research Seed Grant Program.

How to Submit: To apply to this program, PIs must follow the internal submission process detailed below. Please note that myResearch is not required for this submission. PIs must complete the full application in the Foundant online grant management system five (5) days in advance of the targeted SUNY deadline, to allow time for review and to obtain signatures from the VPR and Provost. Applications must be completed in the portal by Monday, March 25, 2024, but we encourage early submission to ensure enough time for routing and to obtain signatures. If an application is not received before the five (5) day deadline, the PI will be in jeopardy of not being able to submit. PIs must provide their OSP Pre-Award Specialist with the 'Can Submit' permission through the 'Collaborate' function in the submission portal.

SUNY Deadlines: March 31, 2024; June 30, 2024

Any questions should be directed to PI's <u>OSP Pre-Award Specialist</u> in the Office of Sponsored Programs.

Presidential Mini-Grants for Departmental Diversity Initiative

Description: This long-standing program supports selected proposals that promote awareness, skills and knowledge about issues related to race, gender, gender identity, sexual orientation, ethnicity, socio-economic status, abilities, age, class and/or religion. Drawing on the total pool of \$30,000, the amount granted will be determined by the number of grants selected and approved for funding. Grants generally range from \$1,000 - \$4,000. Preference will be given to proposals that are tied to the goals of the Stony Brook Plan for Equity, Inclusion, and Diversity.

How to Apply: The Presidential Mini-Grants for Departmental Diversity Initiative was designed to foster projects that promote, enhance, and celebrate diversity, equity, and inclusion (DEI) at Stony Brook University. To encourage continued innovative campus-wide DEI programming, I invite you to take part in this year's mini-grant application process.

Who We Are: The Center for Health Outcomes and Policy Research at the University of Pennsylvania School of Nursing has produced impactful evidence demonstrating the importance of adequate staffing and a good work environment for nurses' well-being, quality of care, patient safety, good patient outcomes, and health equity in all settings where nurses work. The results of this research are used to inform and implement policy and organizational practices that

support nurses in their work and value the contributions of nurses for patients, families, and communities.

- All nurses are eligible to participate whether working, retired, not currently working, or in some other situation.
- Participation is voluntary—by completing the survey, you give your consent to participate.
- Data are protected under a federal NIH Certificate of Confidentiality.
- Your responses are confidential and deidentified—your name will not be linked with your responses.
- Data will be used in aggregate with no identifying information to prepare scientific reports, peer-reviewed articles, and policy briefs.
- Nurses4All uses advanced encryption technology which establishes a secure and encrypted connection.
- The Nurses4All survey can be taken on smartphones, tablets, or desktop and laptop computers.
