The goal of the study is to examine if incorporating motivation to be more active into a clinical visit will help cancer survivors increase or maintain an active lifestyle. The study, "*Effectiveness and Implementation of a Tailored Motivation–Focused Physical Activity Intervention for World Trade Center Health Program Cancer Survivors*", will open for accrual early this fall and the project will run through June 2026.
