RNBP Clinical Practice Portfolios

RN Baccalaureate students are required to submit a two-part Clinical Practice Portfolio. The first, called the **Preliminary Clinical Practice Portfolio**, must be submitted within five months of beginning the RN to Baccalaureate Program. The **HNC 479 Clinical Practice Portfolio**, which builds upon the information presented in the Preliminary Portfolio, is a course requirement for HNC 479, Transitions to Professional Practice. The purpose and guidelines for preparing both portfolios are provided below.

The Preliminary Portfolio

The Preliminary Clinical Practice Portfolio serves two purposes:

- 1. To provide insight into the professional practice and previous experience of the RN to Baccalaureate student. Required paperwork for the Preliminary Portfolio also indicates the capabilities of the student, as well as weaknesses that may need to be addressed in the Baccalaureate program.
- 2. To be evaluated for 28 Advanced Placement credits for students who are not on the SUNY Transfer Path.

Guidelines for Developing the Preliminary Clinical Practice Portfolio

The following required paperwork must be included in the Preliminary Portfolio:

- 1. Professional Resume (with anticipated date of graduation from Stony Brook University included)
- 2. Current RN License/Certificate of Registration
- 3. Proof of RN malpractice insurance (Declaration page or Certificate of Insurance)
- 4. Copy of most recent Performance Evaluation from supervisor (if employed for over one year). Copy of most recent academic Clinical Performance Evaluation from AAS faculty (if unemployed or without one or more years of RN work experience).
- 5. Clinical Practice Portfolio Assessment Tool (completed by supervisor if employed) or AAS faculty (if unemployed and without RN work experience).
- 6. Proof of Professional/Personal Development The student must provide evidence that he/she has completed at least three continuing education, in-service, or other profession-related courses within the last three years. This may include professional conferences attended or educational programs develop and taught by the student prior to admission to the RN to Baccalaureate program. (Please note, BLS, which is required for admission to the program, **DOES NOT** fulfill the requirements for this category.)
- 7. Comprehensive Description of Clinical Experiences to date. This description should include dates, patient populations, and sites of clinical experiences. Registered Nurses who have been employed for one year or more should provide a detailed description of experiences gained during employment only. Unemployed students with no RN experience, or those employed for less than one year as an RN must include a detailed description of all clinical experience gained during their academic clinical rotations, as well as any employment experience as a Registered Nurse.
- 8. Evidence of at least one Community Service Activity completed within the last three years.

Although not required, the Preliminary Portfolio may also contain:

- 9. Professional memberships, honors, awards, and/or grants
- 10. Professional activities
- 11. Published manuscripts
- 12. Any additional materials that provide an indication of the student's commitment to the nursing profession.

Eligibility:

- Undergraduates matriculated in Stony Brook University School of Nursing RN to Baccalaureate or Baccalaureate to Master's Program
- Undergraduates submitting a Preliminary Portfolio must have a current RN license.

RN Baccalaureate and RN Baccalaureate to Master's students who do not meet eligibility requirements for the Preliminary Portfolio will not be permitted to remain matriculated in the program.

IMPORTANT, PLEASE NOTE: All portfolios must be submitted in a professional manner to the Office of Student Affairs within six months of starting the RN to Baccalaureate program. Portfolios must be presented as hard copy documents in binders with tabbed dividers notating each of the criteria. Failure to do so may require that your portfolio be returned to you for resubmission.

Students are required to retain copies of all submitted documents, as many of these materials will be resubmitted in the HNC 479 Clinical Practice Portfolio. Students will be notified by email when their Preliminary Portfolio has been reviewed and available to be picked up at the Office of Student Affairs. All Preliminary Clinical Practice Portfolios must be picked up from the Office of Student Affairs within four weeks of this notification. Due to space restraints, Preliminary Clinical Practice Portfolios that are not picked up within four weeks of notification will be shredded.

Preliminary Clinical Practice Portfolio Evaluation:

A subcommittee of the Admissions and Academic Standards Committee will evaluate the Preliminary Clinical Practice Portfolios. This evaluation will result in a grade of Pass/Fail, or a request to resubmit with revised or additional documentation. All Portfolio evaluations will be place in the student's file in the School of Nursing.
