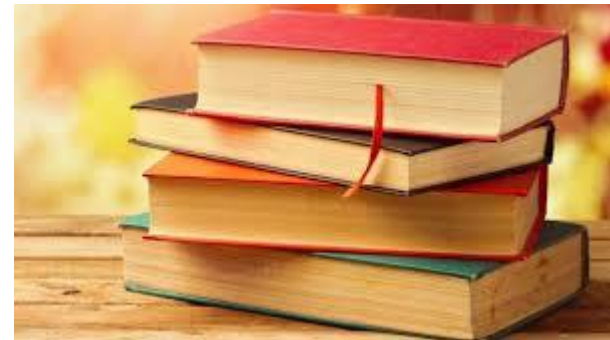
The Registered Nurse to Baccalaureate Degree Program (RNBP) is designed for students with either an associate's degree or diploma in nursing. The curriculum is concentrated in upper-division Nursing and Liberal Arts courses and leads to a

## Bachelor of Science degree with a major in Nursing



- Faculty available onsite and online
- Not a competitive admission process, no interviews or testing
- No limit to the number of students accepted
- A predominately online asynchronous program
- Currently there are two onsite days and one virtual synchronous day.  
(6-8 weeks notice given for all mandatory days)
- All courses are offered through the SON
- **Seats for all required classes are guaranteed (You can't be closed out of a required course.)**
- RN license is not required to begin the program
- Brightspace learning platform
- New York State tuition
- **Stony Brook University's SON reputation**
- Fully accredited program





- **Associate's degree or diploma in nursing**
- A cumulative GPA  $\geq 2.5$  from all schools attended (including Advanced Placement courses)
- 60 credits from your previous coursework with a grade of C or better
- Prerequisite courses *do not* age out.

An RN license is *not required* prior to starting the program.

New graduates are given up to 6 months to pass the NCLEX exam.

The RN to Baccalaureate Program (RNBP) has one admission date:

Summer Session 1- which begins at the end of May

***A virtual pre-recorded orientation program will be distributed in by mid-April.***

***All accepted students must listen to the entire orientation program and respond as directed.***



## Part-time Pathway

- 2 - year pathway
- 3 - 11 credits per semester or session
- Continuous pathway

HNC 469 – Population Health

HNC 470 – Nursing Leadership Practicum: A Capstone Experience





- All students are accepted on the part-time pathway
- The two-year, part-time pathway was developed for working RNs
- Designed so that working students can do well and progress to competitive graduate programs.
- If necessary, transition to a slower pathway is possible.

If you have a previous Baccalaureate degree in another discipline, you may be eligible to transfer up to 19 credits of your previous 300 & 400 level liberal arts courses to the RN to Baccalaureate Program, resulting in a decrease in the number of courses you must complete.

- Official transcripts and course descriptions must be submitted to me and the SON Office of Student Affairs for consideration
- Decisions regarding transfer credit are made on an individual basis



- Applications open August 1<sup>st</sup>

*Do not apply to Stony Brook main campus or use the SUNY common application*

- Unofficial transcripts from all colleges/universities ever attended must be uploaded onto the electronic application (must be readable transcripts)
- All preadmission coursework must be completed with a grade of C or higher.
- References – submitted electronically via the online application
  - Email addresses of 3 professional references
  - Vary your selection
  - Family and friends are not acceptable
- Personal statement/essay is required
- Completion of all preadmission coursework is required prior to starting the program.
- All outstanding preadmission coursework must be posted on the official transcripts and the official transcripts submitted after acceptance into the program. **However, new associate degree graduates will be given additional time to submit their school of nursing transcripts.**
- No onsite interview and testing



- Minimum GPA = 3.0
- At least one year of experience as a registered nurse in your clinical area of interest
- You may be interviewed as part of the admission process
- Conditional seat in a SON nurse practitioner program
- Available for nurse practitioner programs only
- *Extremely competitive admission process*

- Applications are submitted directly to the School of Nursing
- The Admissions and Academic Standards Committee and the Dean of the School of Nursing make final decisions regarding the selection of incoming classes



You will need to provide:

- The email addresses of three professional references
- Unofficial transcripts from all programs attended
- A personal statement
- \$50 application fee



Those admitted will need to provide:

- All official transcripts
- Proof of BLS-AED
- Health records and titers
- Evidence of health insurance
- Evidence of student malpractice
- Evidence of completion of prerequisites
