Welcome to the first issue of our revitalized alumni newsletter! Each issue, we will highlight important school news, activities, and alumni and student achievements. We hope you'll find this newsletter informative, inspiring,

It's a source of great pride among the faculty and staff that our alumni stay engaged with Stony Brook University School of Nursing and keep us up-to-date on personal and professional successes. We enjoy hearing from our alumni and want to be sure that conversation is flowing both ways so that regular updates are provided on how we keep ahead of trends in the nursing profession and in education.

As we are facing a critical nursing shortage in New York and across the country, Stony Brook University School of Nursing is committed to addressing this challenge. For example, this past year, the School of Nursing admitted its first class of Acute Care Nurse Practitioners in both the Adult-Gerontology Nurse Practitioner and Pediatric Nurse Practitioner Programs. While each program admitted 10 students, these programs are expected to grow to meet the current demands for care.

In addition, the SON recently initiated two novel programs. The Bridge to Baccalaureate program, funded through a NYS High Needs Nursing Grant, created two additional articulation agreements with SUNY community colleges: Duchess County Community College and Fulton Montgomery Community College. The development of these new clinical partnerships in the community colleges' geographic regions will afford students the opportunity to attend classes without commuting to the Stony Brook campus. New clinical partnerships will create potential job opportunities for new RNs while serving the healthcare needs of the communities where they live.

Dean Bruckenthal's message continued

The second initiative is a partnership with the Long Island State Veteran's Home (LISVH). Long-term care facilities are experiencing severe challenges in nurse staffing resulting in numerous vacant nurse positions. With funding from a Veteran's Administration grant, we were able to develop a partnership with the LISVH that secured an annual opportunity for three years for twelve (12) Associate Degree Registered Nurses who wish to obtain their bachelor's degrees. The LISVH-SBSON partnership will provide tuition reimbursement for these registered nurses who wish to attend a baccalaureate completion program at Stony Brook University's School of Nursing while working at the LISVH for a period of three years.

We also need you to help guide our new nurses into the profession during these challenging times. Our alumni are pushing the boundaries of what is possible and what is expected in nursing today. Our students are exploring the intersection of nursing and the health care system and society, and are poised to become talented, principled leader's intent on having a purposeful and positive impact on the health care of individuals, families, and communities. Your stories are inspirational and will help to ignite and sustain their passion for nursing. We want to celebrate your contributions to the profession, so be sure to stay in touch. The news and stories we share together will provide insights into how we are doing this important work together.

I hope you enjoy reading this newsletter, and I wish you all the best.

2023 Distinguished Alumni Award Recipient,

Dr. Terri Marin

Dr. Terri Marin graduated Stony Brook University in 2002 from the Neonatal Nurse Practitioner program. Since Dr. Marin graduated, she earned her PhD in Nursing from Emory University in 2018. She has become a respected, grant-funded researcher in the use of near-infrared spectroscopy in neonatal renal injury and gut oxygenation. Dr. Marin is one of a few neonatal nurse researchers in the country.

She is well published, a national speaker, and is the editor of the neonatal section of the Journal of Perinatal and Neonatal Nursing. Dr. Marin was recently tenured as an Associate Professor at Augusta University College of Nursing.

Janet Zenk

Janet Zenk was born in 1926 to Walter and Helen Scherr and grew up in Ozone Park, Queens. Janet Zenk enrolled in the Mary Immaculate Hospital School of Nursing and then worked part-time as a nurse at what is now Good Samaritan University Hospital for many years to keep her skills up to date while she raised five children with husband Martin Zenk. She returned to school in her late 40s when her children were older, eventually earning a master's degree from Stony Brook's nurse practitioner program.

Janet Zenk specialized in adult health. She loved learning and was always encouraging nurses to go back to school to further their education. She was a pioneer in Nursing and joined the Stony Brook Nursing faculty having a dual position as Educator with a Clinical Role in the first Hypertension Clinic at the Northport VA staffed with Nurse Practitioners.

2023 Future Nurse Leader Award Recipient

Congratulations Stony Brook
University School of Nursing (SBU-SON) Class of 2023 Graduate, Jaclyn Jahn, who was named a recipient of the 2023 Future Nurse Leader Award by the American Nurses Association – New York (ANA-NY).

The Future Nurse Leader Award is given to students nominated by their respective schools as outstanding students who demonstrate leadership, make significant contributions to their school, promote activity in nursing organizations, and embody the values and ethics of nursing. This year, ANA-NY is awarding 17 students in New York State with the honor.





Dr. Janet Galiczewski, Chair of Undergraduate Studies in the School of Nursing and an ANA member, nominated Ms. Jahn for the award.

Ms. Jahn has also demonstrated excellence in the field of discovery. Before she began her nursing studies, she contributed to a published paper related to aortic valve replacement in the Journal of International Cardiology alongside Dr. Kenneth Faulkner of the SBU-SON. As part of the Nursing Scholars Program, she conducted research with the former dean of the school on the association between financial resources, student resources, and student success. She presented the findings at the Eastern Nursing Research Society Conference (ENRS) last spring.

Interdisciplinary Guided Network for Investigation, Translation, and Equity (IGNITE) Event

Two faculty members from the School of Nursing were recently accepted to participate in the Interdisciplinary Guided Network for Investigation, Translation, and Equity (IGNITE) Train-the-Trainer in-person event. This 2-day in person program introduced participants to the All of Us Research Program, Data Browser and Data Workbench with the aim of both learning how to use these powerful tools and sharing this knowledge with other researchers.

The aim of the All of Us Research Program focuses on: developing partnerships with diverse communities that reflect the demographics of the US population; building an expansive biomedical dataset; and synthesizing partnerships between communities, researchers and funders.
